Glossary

Life expectancy at birth: The average number of years that a new-born could expect to live if he or she were to pass through life exposed to the sex- and age-specific death rates prevailing at the time of his or her birth, for a specific year, in a given country, territory or geographical area.

Maternal mortality ratio: The annual number of female deaths from any cause related to or aggravated by pregnancy or its management (excluding accidental or incidental causes) during pregnancy and childbirth or within 42 days of termination of pregnancy, irrespective of the duration and site of the pregnancy, expressed per 100,000 live births, for a specified time period.

Perinatal mortality rate: Combined number of deaths of babies aged less than 7 days and the number of stillbirths in a year per 1,000 total births during the year.

Neonatal mortality rate: Probability that a child born in a specific year or period will die during the first 28 completed days of life if subject to age-specific mortality rates of that period, expressed per 1,000 live births.

Infant mortality rate: The probability that a child born in a specific year or period will die before reaching the age of 1 year, if subject to age-specific mortality rates of that period, expressed as a rate per 1,000 live births.

Under-five mortality rate: The probability of a child born in a specific year or period dying before reaching the age of 5 years, if subject to age-specific mortality rates of that period, expressed per 1,000 live births.

Stillbirth: The complete expulsion or extraction of a foetus from a female after at least 26 weeks pregnancy or after attaining a weight of 800 grams or more, where after such expulsion or extraction there is no breathing, beating of the heart, pulsation of the umbilical cord or unmistakable movement of voluntary muscle.

Key findings at a glance...

The key findings are as follows:

Births and fertility have continued to decline year-on-year.

- Fertility rate is well below replacement level (1.7 in 2025, replacement level is 2.1).
- The sex ratio at birth remained relatively balanced, with near-equal numbers of male and female births.
- Large variations in fertility and births across districts. Drop in births in certain traditionally high-fertility districts like Perseverance.
- Teenage pregnancy rates have steadily declined from 2021 to 2025.
- There were 407 recorded abortions in 2025, consistent with recent years and below historical levels.

Death rates are decreasing gradually.

- There were no maternal deaths recorded in 2025.
- Infant and child mortality indicators improved further between 2024 and 2025, reaching levels among the best recorded over the past 15 years.

The pattern of causes of death reflects a continued burden of non-communicable diseases.

- Deaths from cancers increased slightly, while deaths from heart disease and respiratory infections declined modestly. Deaths from diabetes remain higher than in previous years.
- 54% of all deaths had one of the four key non-communicable diseases as the underlying cause of death, disproportionately affecting older age groups and males.

Life expectancy has reached historically high levels, with persistent gender differences.

- Highest life expectancy at birth recorded since 1970 for males (73.1 years) and overall (77.0 years).
- Female life expectancy at birth (81.4 years) remains close to its historical peak.
- The substantial male-female life expectancy gap persists, with females continuing to live considerably longer than males.

1.0 Introduction

Vital statistics comprise key demographic events within a population, including births, deaths, marriages, and divorces, typically presented in numerical form. This report provides an overview of births and deaths recorded in Seychelles in 2025 and compiled and analysed by the Ministry of Health (MOH). The “causes of death” are classified according to the 11th revision of the International Classification of Diseases (ICD-11).

In Seychelles, the Civil Status Office (Department of Civil Status) is the legal authority for the registration of vital events and, consequently, the production of vital statistics. To enhance the completeness, accuracy, and consistency of the data, records were cross-verified with information from Seychelles Hospital, including its wards, maternity unit, and mortuary, as well as hospitals in Praslin and La Digue and various Primary Healthcare Centres. Additionally, this report references relevant publications from the National Bureau of Statistics (NBS).

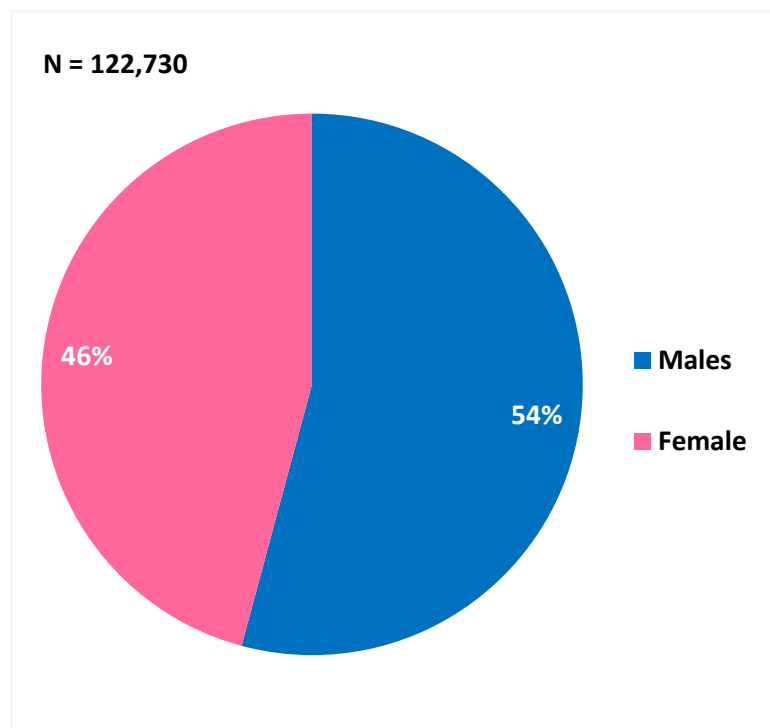
As part of the data validation and quality-assurance process, a validation meeting was held in March 2026 with key stakeholders from within and outside the Ministry of Health. The data and key findings presented in this report were reviewed and discussed during the meeting, and the findings were subsequently validated and endorsed by the participating stakeholders.

2.0 Seychelles Population

The mid-year all-resident population of Seychelles in 2025 was estimated at **122,730**; indicating a growth rate of 1.1% over population estimates in 2024.¹

The mid-year Seychellois-only population in 2025 was estimated at **101,390** (83% of the all-resident population).

Figure 1 **Seychelles All-Resident Population Distribution by Sex, 2025**

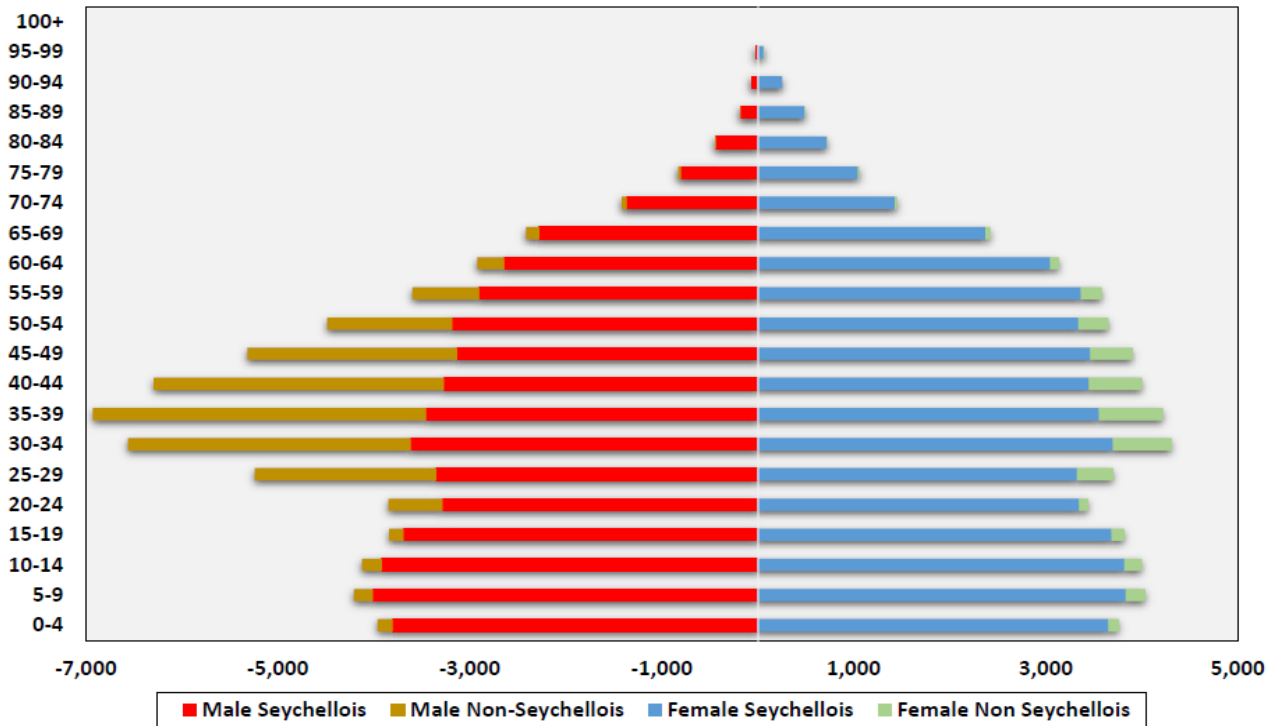


In 2025, the Seychelles all-resident population comprised 66,665 males and 56,065 females, corresponding to approximately 1,189 males per 1,000 females.

Furthermore, 20% of the all-resident population was under 15 years of age, 70% was aged 15-64 years, and 10% was aged 65 years and over.

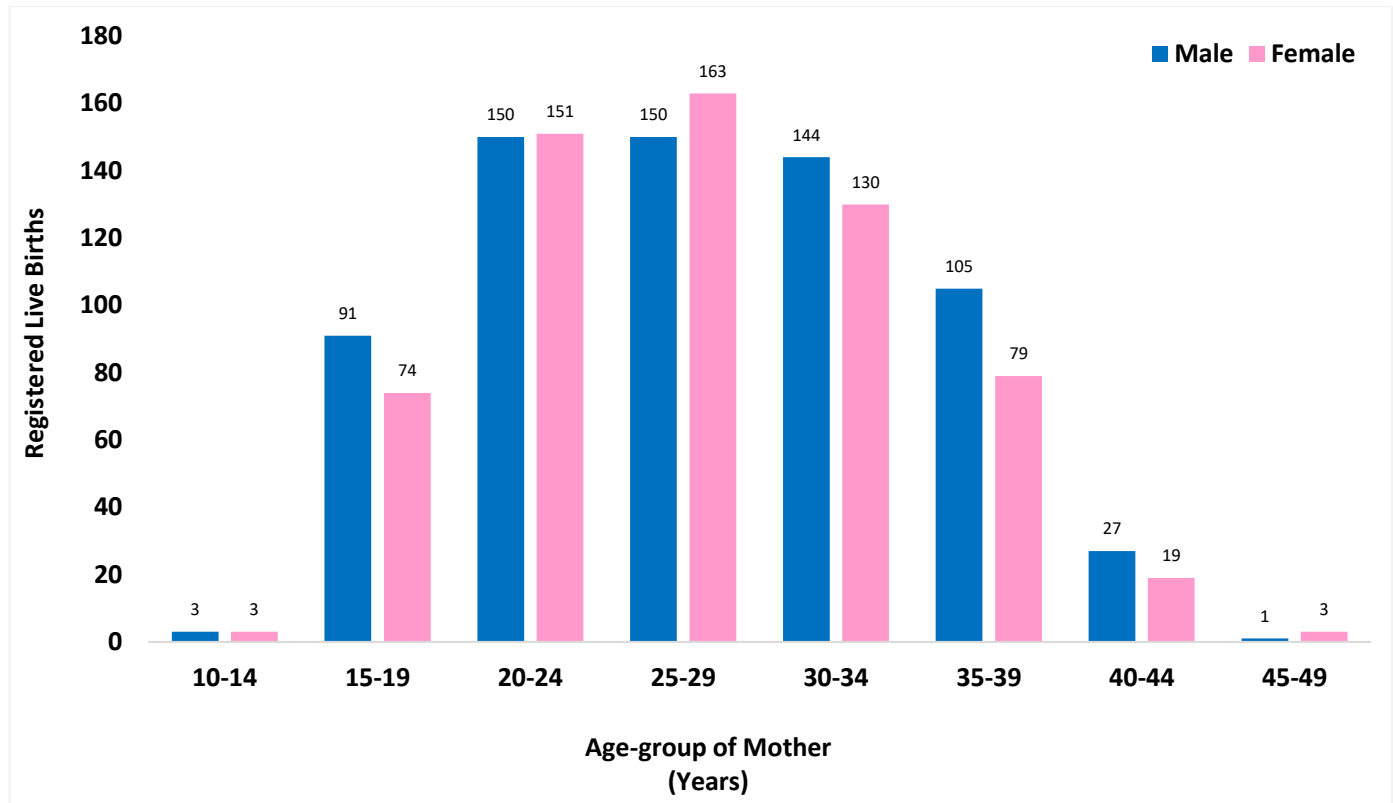

3.3 Fertility



The total fertility rate (TFR) in 2025 was 1.7 children per woman, unchanged from 2024, but down from 2.0 in both 2023 and 2022.

The adolescent fertility rate (AFR) for girls aged 15-19 years declined to 43 per 1,000 in 2025, from 45 in 2024 and 49 in 2023. AFR is a key indicator under SDG target 3.7 (indicator 3.7.2).

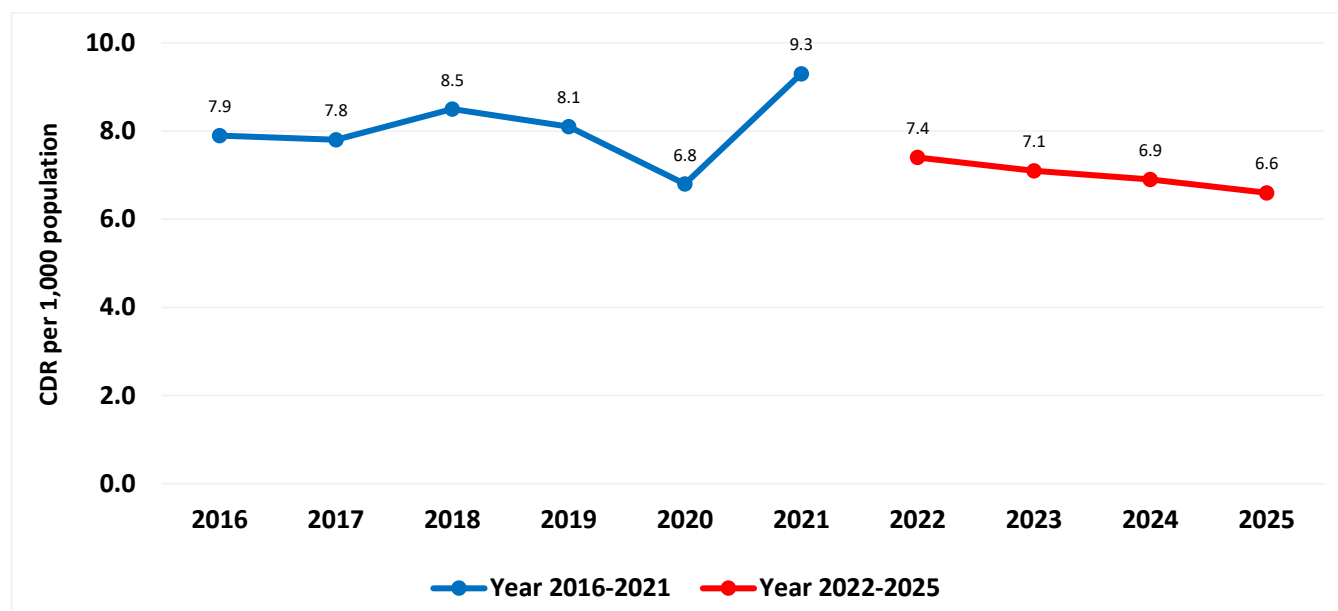

Important:

The methodology for calculating crude death rates (CDR) has been revised by NBS. From 2022 onward, deaths among visitors, tourists, and persons residing in Seychelles for less than six months are excluded from the death count (numerator).

For key disease-specific death counts and mortality estimates, we used the total number of deaths registered in Seychelles, including both residents and non-residents. However, for indicators intended for global comparison—such as the crude death rate and age-standardized mortality rates adjusted to the world population structure—only resident deaths and the resident population were used in the calculations.

This broader count is not used in any population-based rate calculations; rather, it is used descriptively to track overall mortality, observe trends, and analyze causes of deaths.

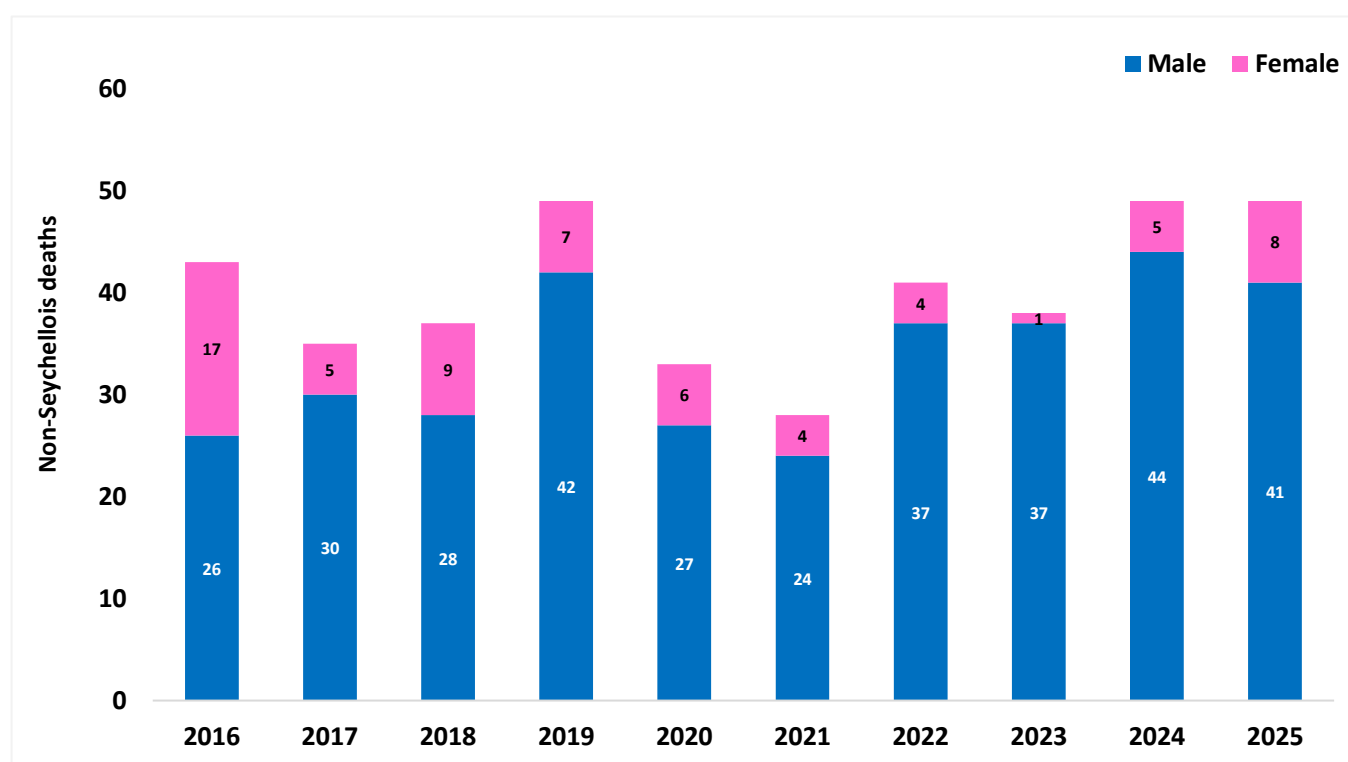

As stated earlier, the Department of Civil Status recorded a total of 845 deaths in 2025, comprising 830 deaths occurring in Seychelles and 15 deaths occurring overseas. Deaths occurring overseas are excluded from the vital statistics analyses; therefore, only deaths registered in Seychelles (n = 830) are included.

Of the 830 deaths registered in Seychelles, 781 were Seychellois citizens resident in Seychelles, 26 were Gainful Occupation Permit (GOP) holders residing and working in Seychelles, and 23 occurred among visitors/foreign nationals.

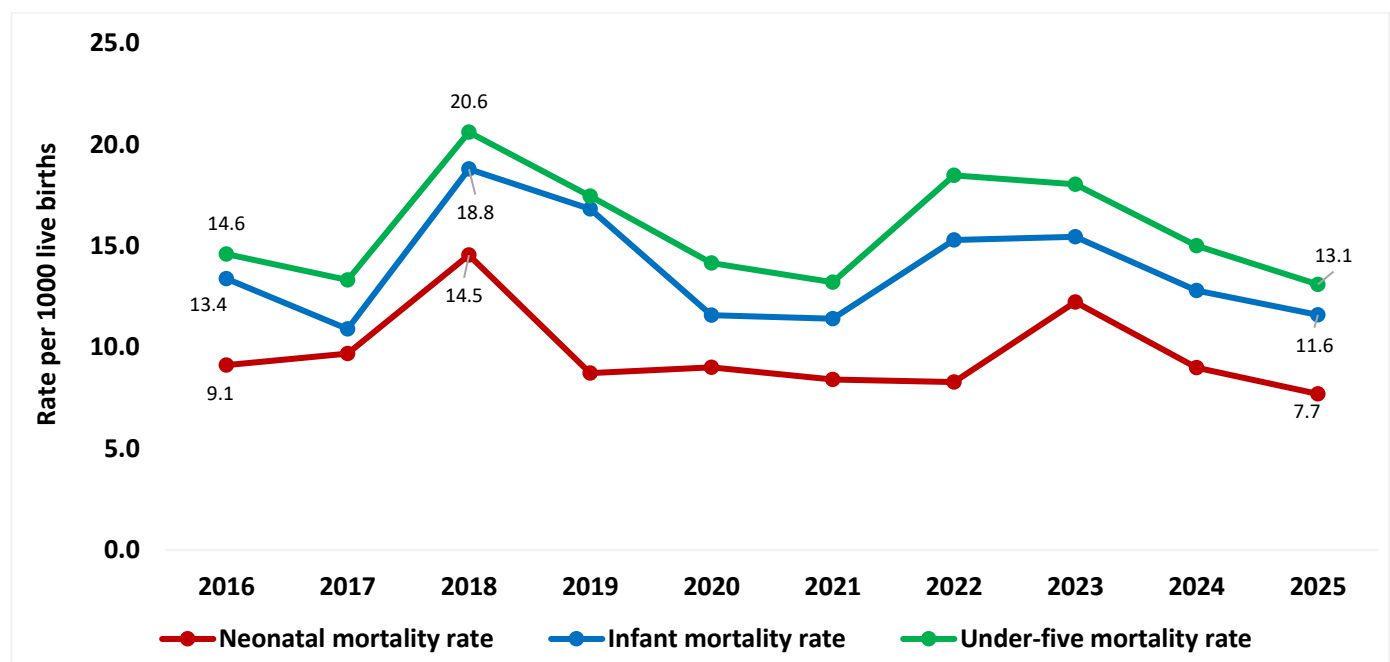

In Seychelles, all maternal deaths undergo formal reviews. In 2025, there were no maternal deaths in Seychelles.

Ten (10) neonatal deaths were recorded in 2025—seven early and three late—marking a decline from 12 in 2024, 19 in 2023 and 13 in 2022.

There were 15 infant deaths in 2025 (including neonatal deaths). Neonatal sepsis was reported as the underlying cause for five of these deaths.

Under-five mortality includes all deaths of infants and children under five years of age. In 2025, there were 17 under-five deaths, with an under-five mortality rate of 13.1 per 1,000 live births.

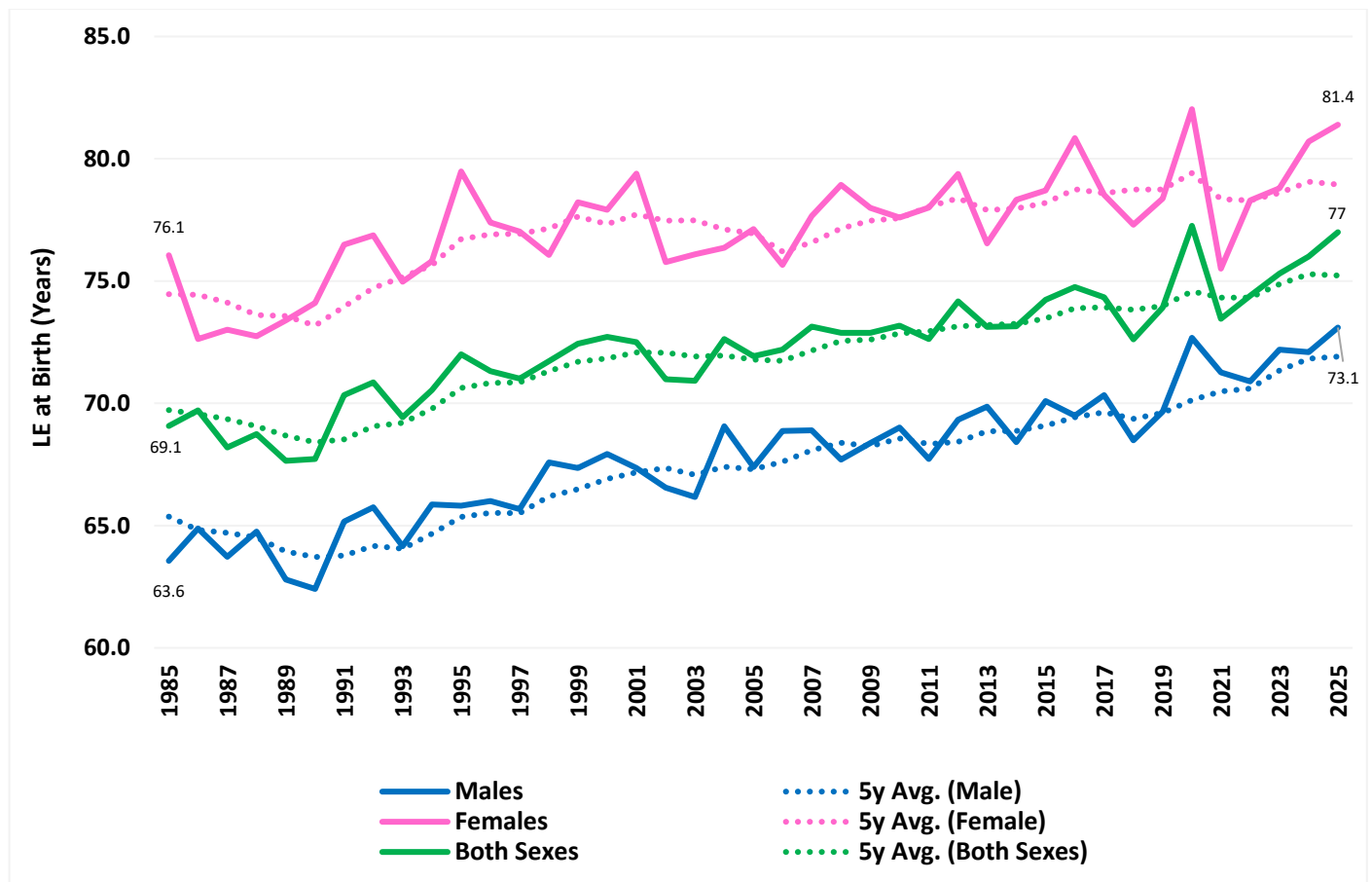

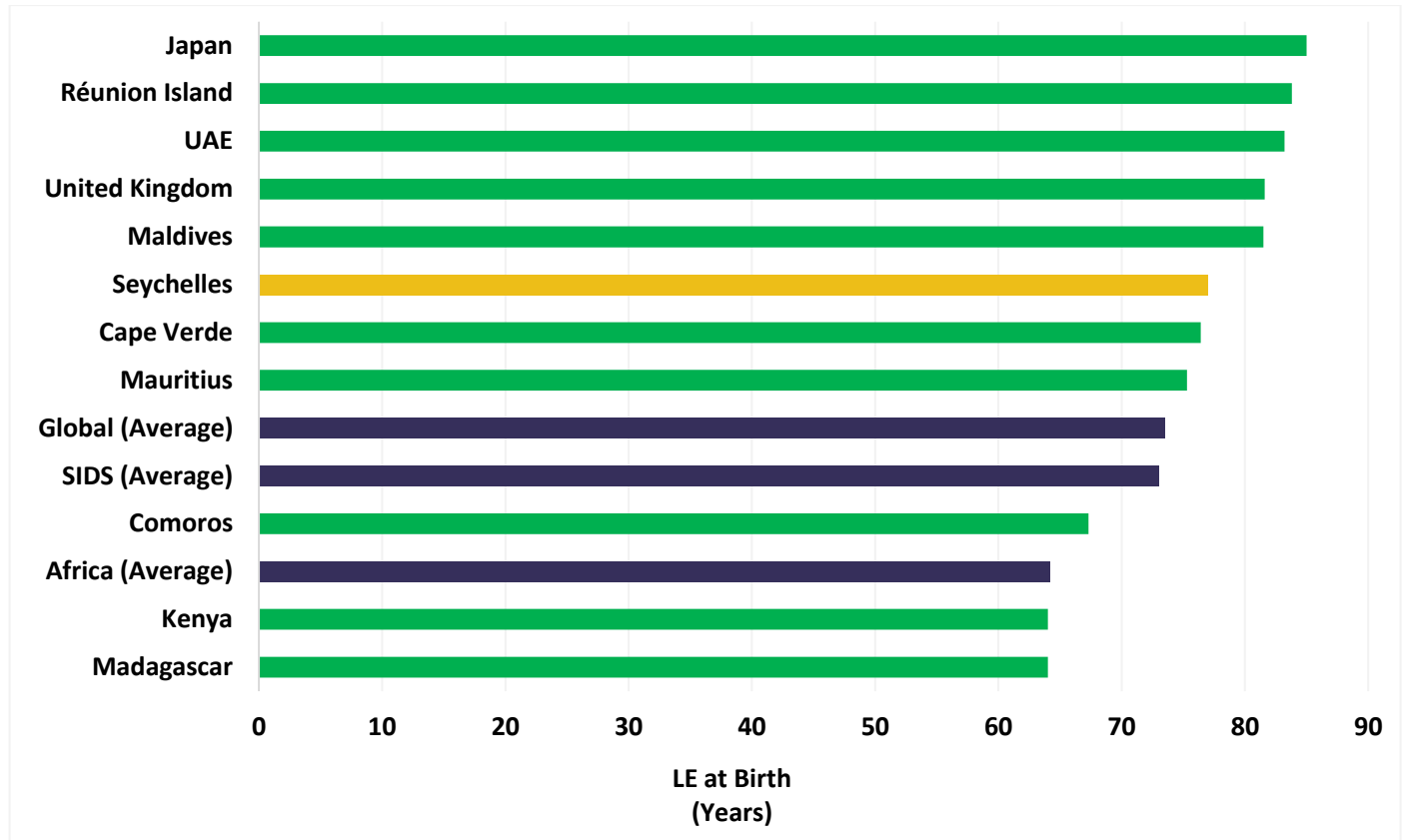

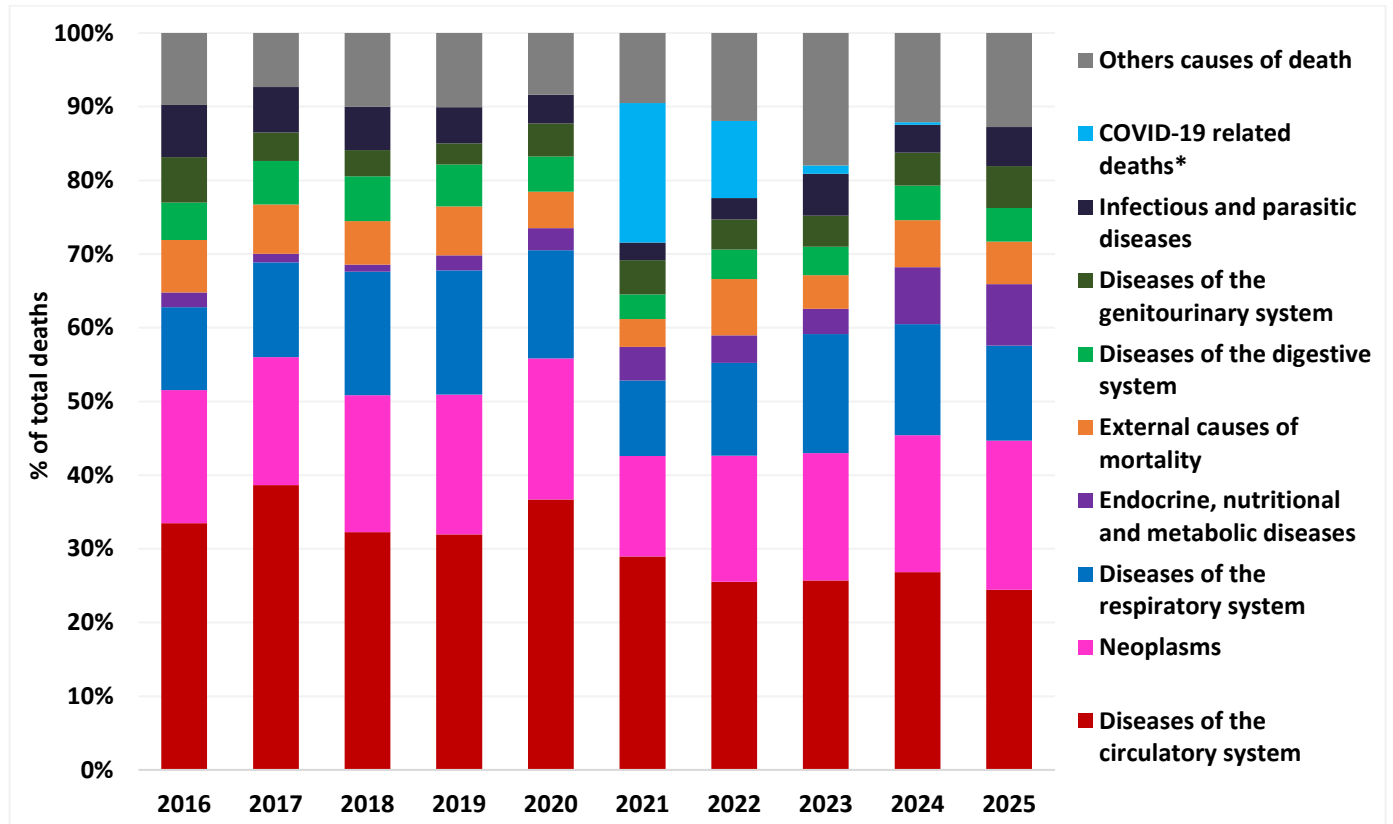

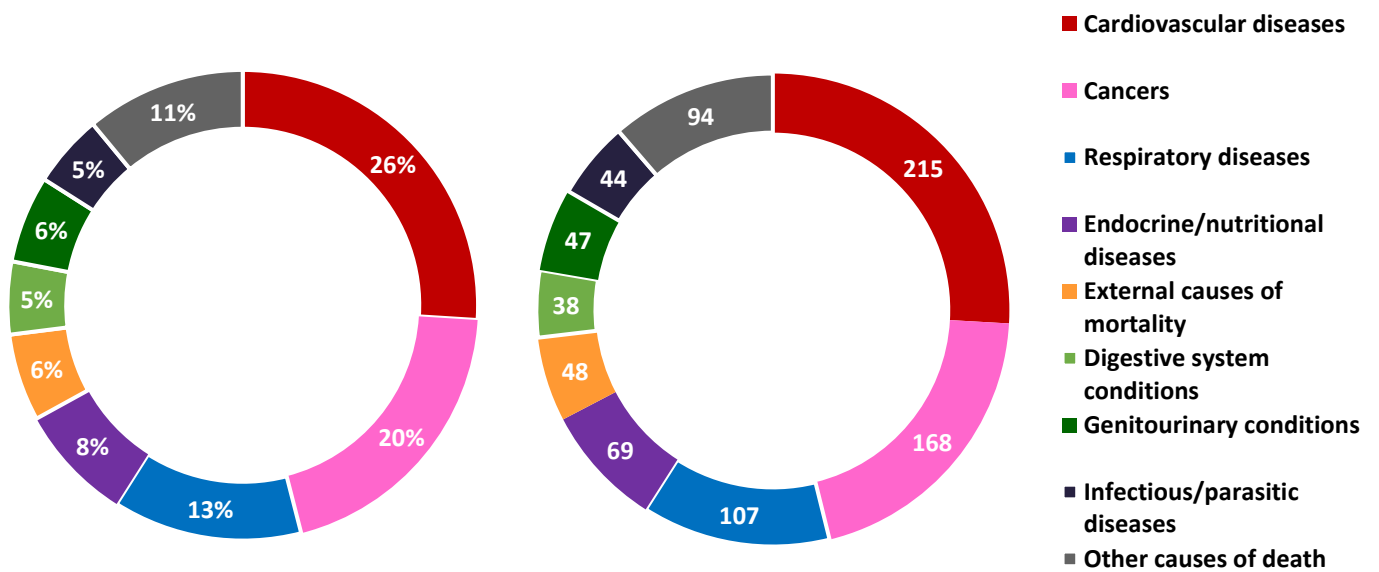

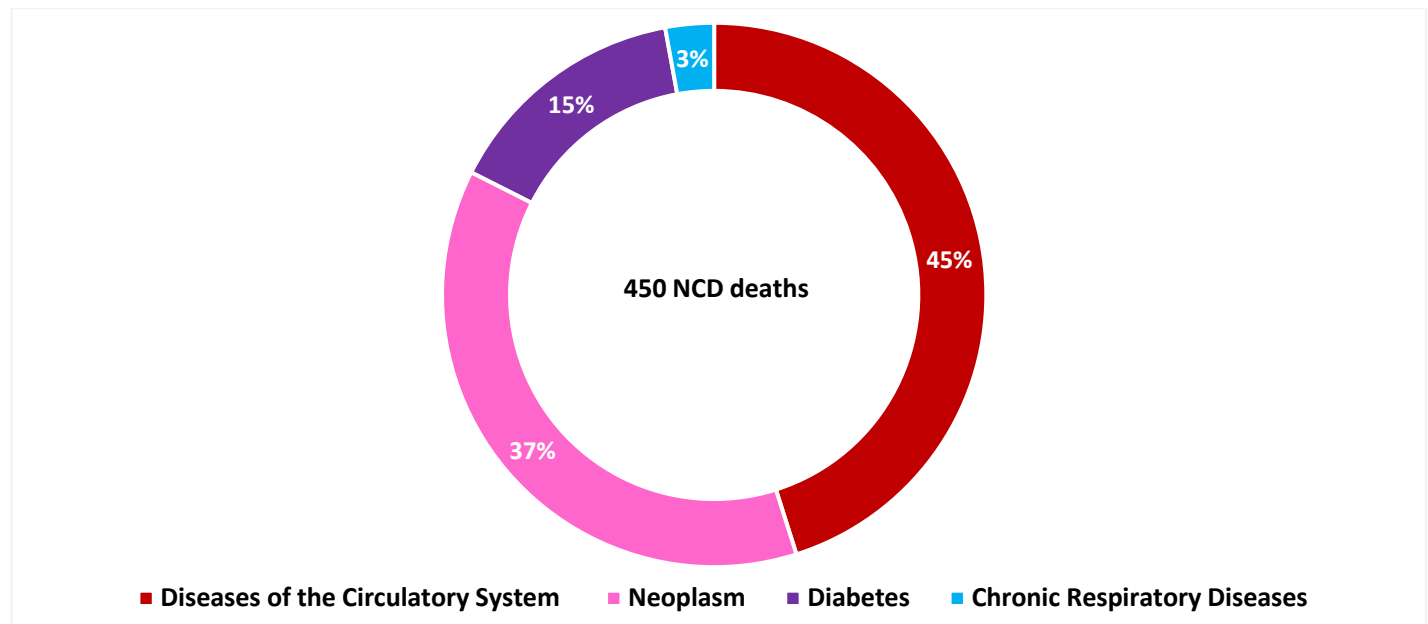

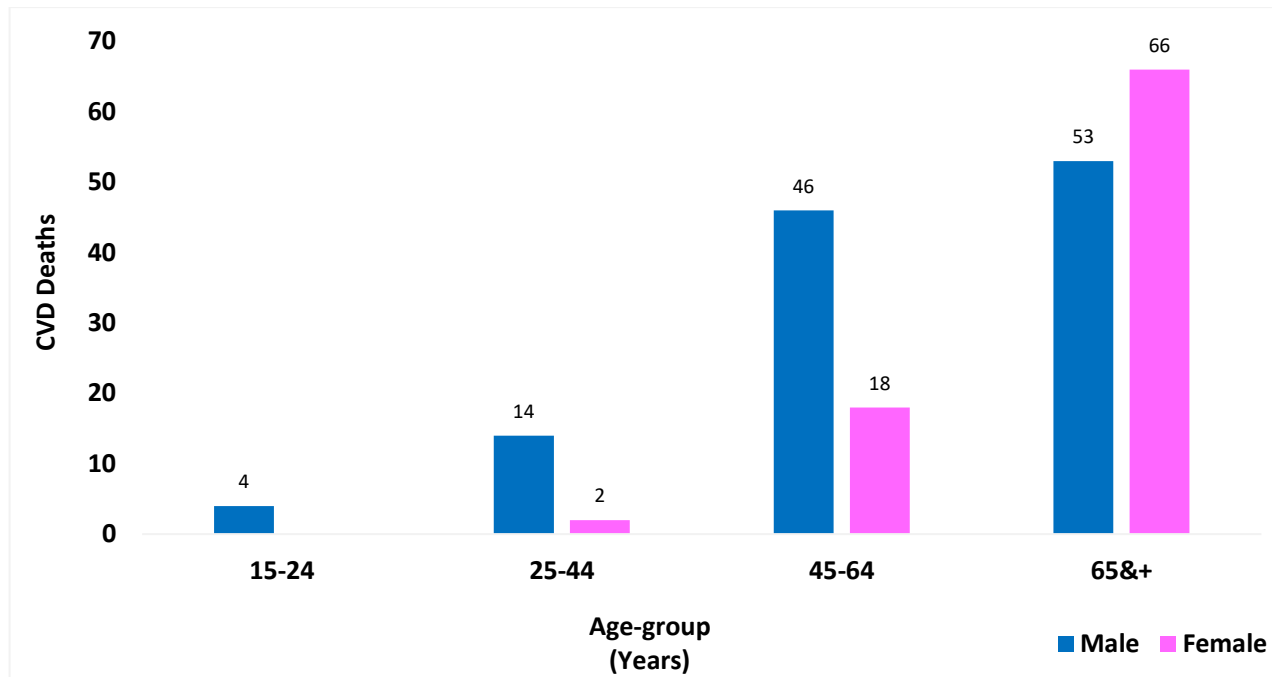
Figure 11 **NCD Mortality, 2025 (N = 450, 54% of total 830 deaths)**

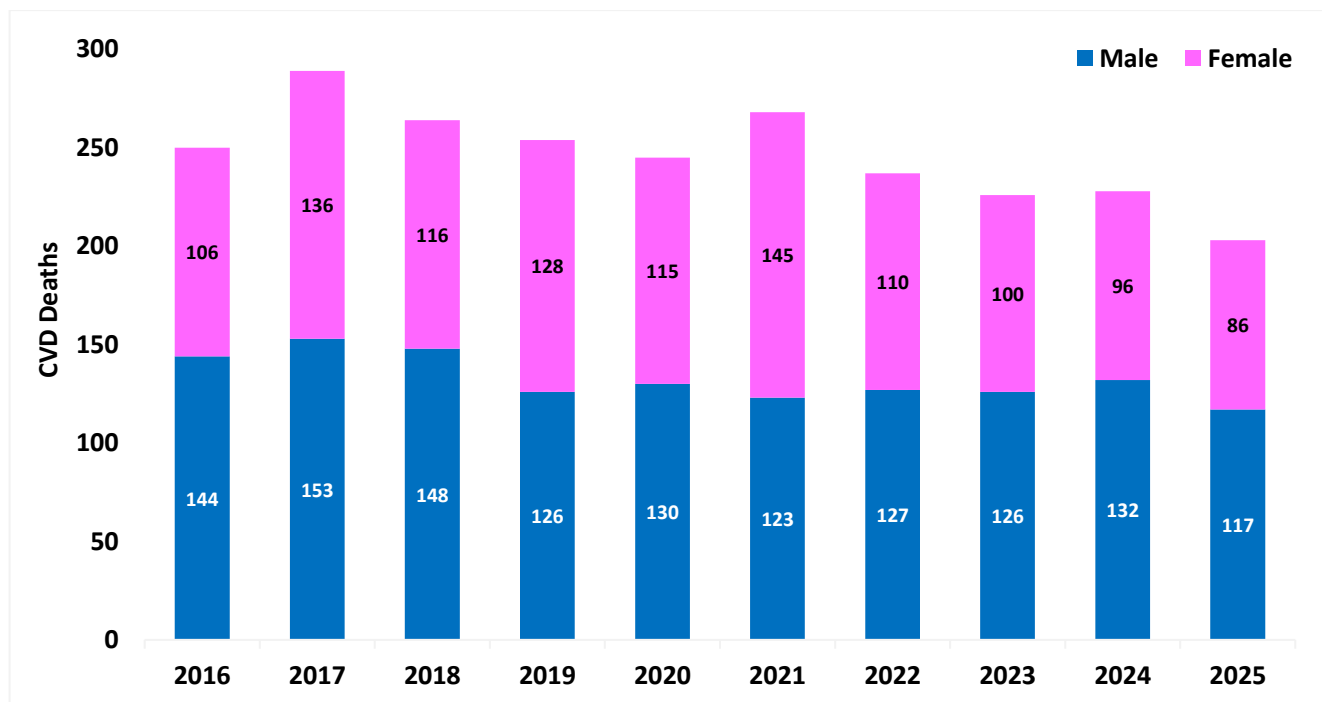

Figure 13 Mortality from Diseases of the Circulatory System by Sex, 2016-2025



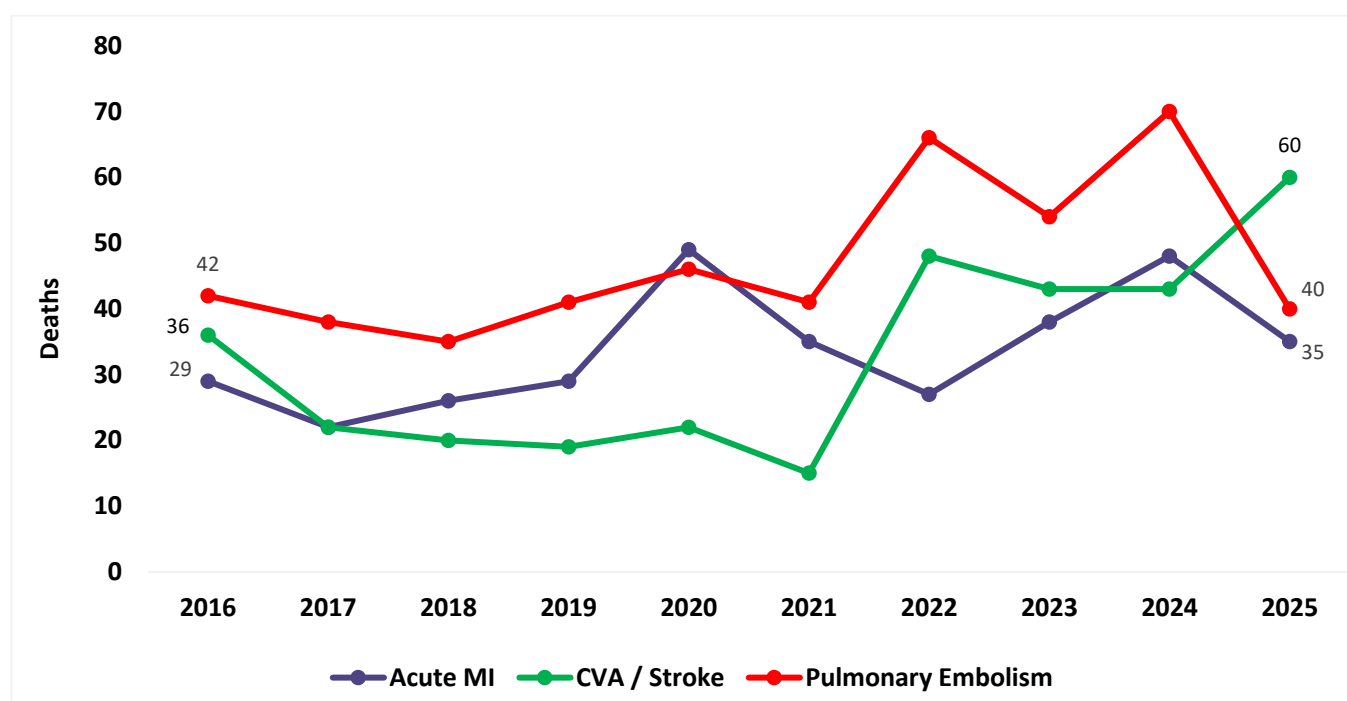

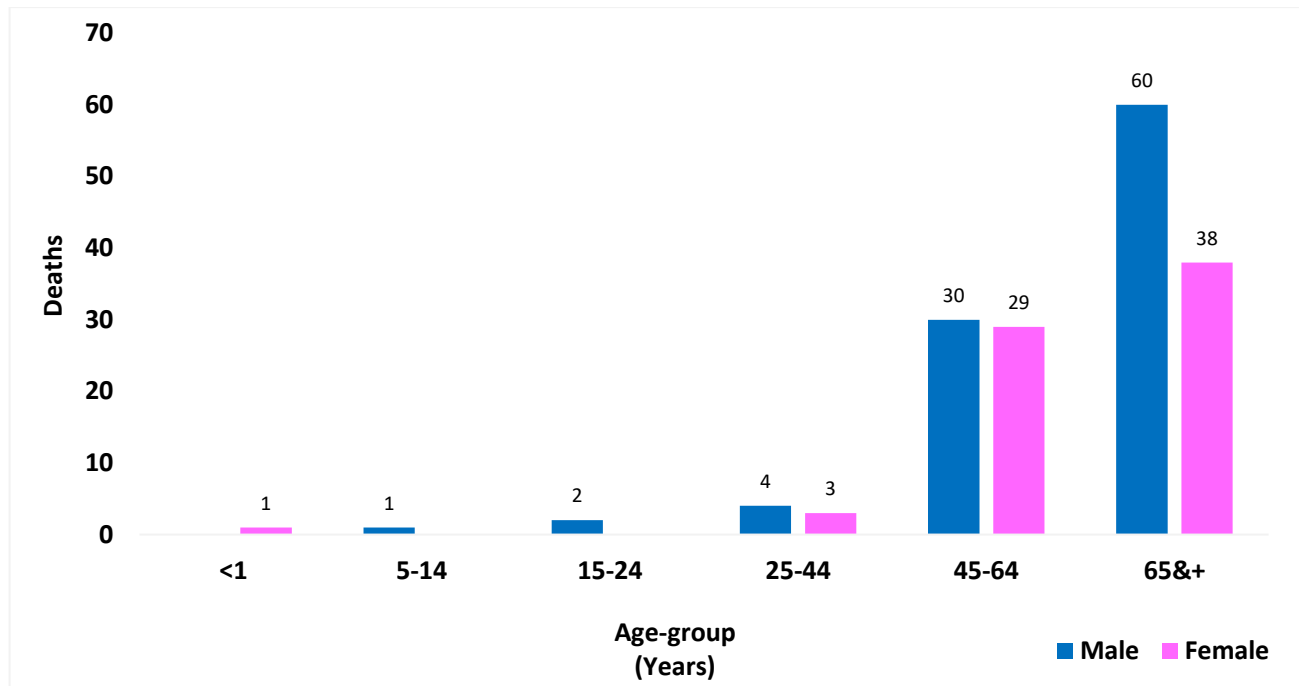

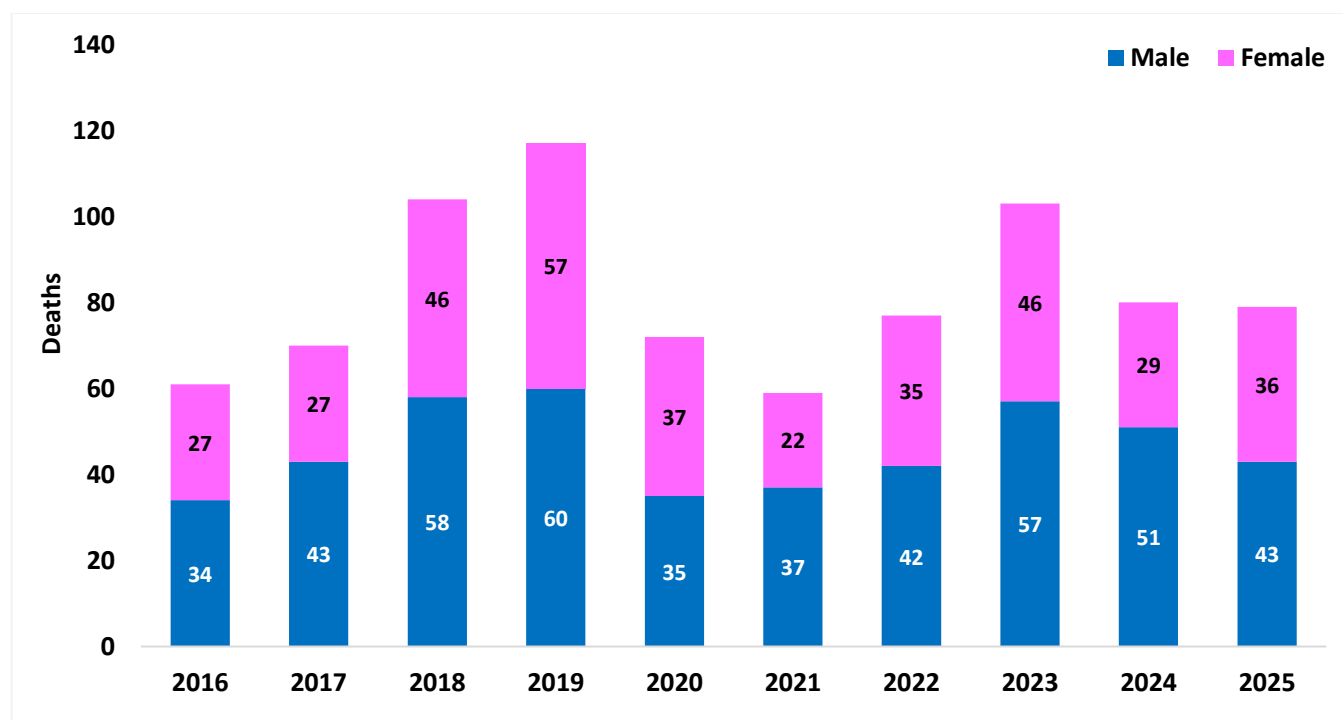

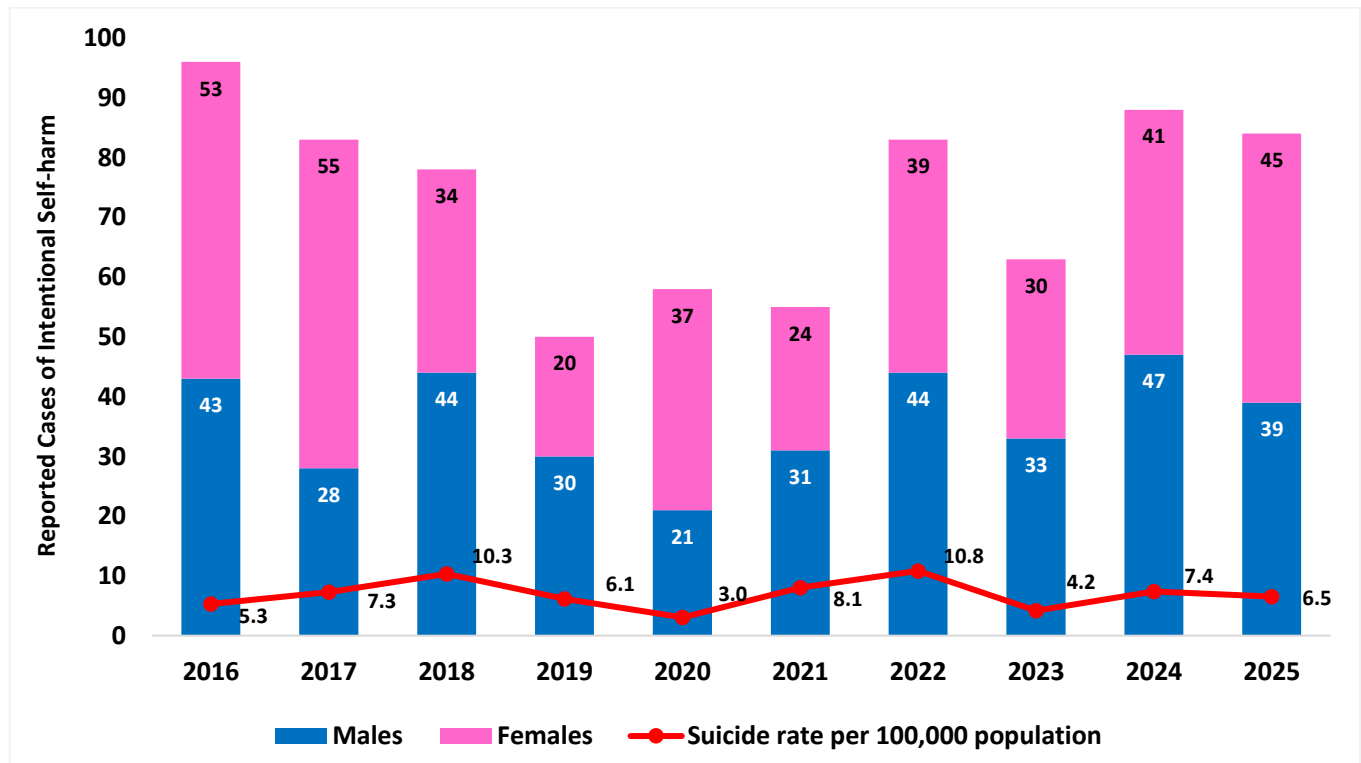
